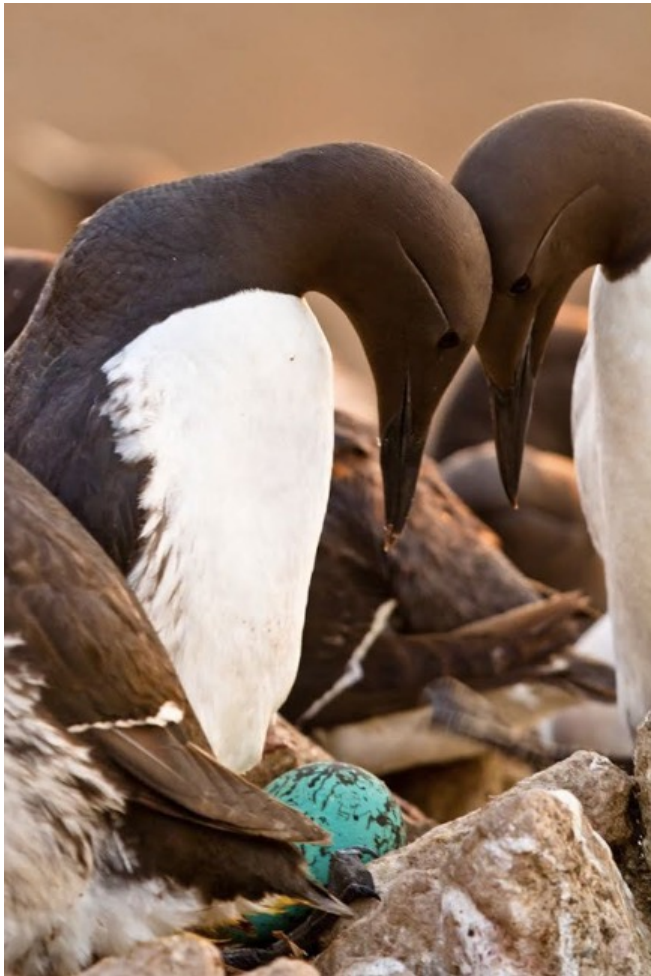


Citizen Science Seabird Monitoring Volunteer Training Begins March 28th, 2018

Join the Trinidad Seabird Citizen Science Project

Volunteers are needed to help gather information about seabird populations in order to help seabirds and other marine wildlife to thrive along the Trinidad Coast. Volunteer training will include information about seabird identification, natural history and scientific data collection as well as providing experience in the field observing seabirds. Citizen Scientists will be asked to contribute a minimum of 3hrs/month seabird monitoring and/or community outreach.
