Simmons Gallery
Trinidad Museum**
Saunders Park is located near the entrance to Trinidad and is home to the Trinidad Museum, Public Library, a park with a native plant garden, and the Simmons Gallery, which also serves as Land Trust office. This donated property is an example of how the land trust has formed innovative partnerships to benefit the entire community.




Old Home Beach
This magnificent beach is often sheltered from wind and is accessible from walking trails in town. Steps guide you to the beach from the bluff vista at the intersection of Trinity and Edwards Street. The Parker Creek trail is another access to this beach, found at the end of Parker Creek Lane and via Wagner Street.



Baker Beach
This is an excellent place to go tide pooling during low tide and for bird watching. Located 1.4 miles south on Scenic Drive, look for the trailhead sign on the west side, just past Baker Ranch Road. The trail is moderately steep and ends with a section of cable steps.

MORE TO EXPLORE
While the trails described in this brochure focus on the Trinidad Coastal Land Trust properties and easements, there are other Trinidad trails you won't want to miss. Trinidad Head Trail is a 1.3 mile loop managed by the City of Trinidad in consultation with local Native American representatives. The Trinidad Head Lighthouse viewing area, managed by the BLM, is open during daylight hours on the first Saturday of every month. Visitors can climb up into the lighthouse between 10am-12pm. Trinidad State Beach, College Cove, and the Elk Head trail provide additional State Park opportunities to enjoy this scenic coast.

Luffenholtz Beach
Visitors can walk out on the point for a dramatic view above the rocky coast, or walk down the stepped but steep beach trail 100 yards to the north. The Luffenholtz Beach trail and point trail parking areas are located approximately 2.0 miles south of Trinidad on Scenic Drive.



Houda Point
A popular beach park for surfers, painters, and bird watchers. There are three steep trails to two beaches and a vista point of Camel Rock. The anchor-chain parking area is located 2.5 miles south on Scenic Drive or take Highway 101 to the Westhaven Road exit down to Scenic Drive, right turn north 0.3 miles.



Moonstone Beach
Easy access to ocean waves and the Little River makes this a great family beach. Portable toilet onsite, limited parking. Located on the south end of Scenic Drive. From Highway 101 north, take the Westhaven Drive exit down to Scenic Drive, left turn to Moonstone Beach Road.
